From the beginning, it is connection that makes all the difference. This is not just true for fruit trees but for every part of this wonderful world.

It all speaks of intentional design – connection applies at every point, even to babies, families, nations and the universe itself. Let's face it – no connection, no you!

This principle also underpins all electrical appliances and internet gadgets. Connection is vital to fulfil three things in all of them, which is also true for every human being:

For example, a TV

- **IDENTITY** – colour TV (of particular brand and model)
- **VALUE** – enjoyment as you watch your favourite programme
- **PURPOSE** – receives and converts signals to show your programme

You are far more complex in design but your Identity, Value and Purpose also come through connection to your Designer who calls himself God.

God wants a lasting connection with you in a relationship as His child and for you to have healthy connections with family, friends and people around you. Human beings do not thrive in lonely isolation. Connection with him brings life to the full – you should not settle for less.



Blockages to *The Connected Life*

God's best for our life is so easily missed as we do our own thing. An old English word used for archers missing the target is sin. Sadly this opens a Pandora's Box of sorrows which block the way to life as God intended it for you.



MASKS

During life, we use different masks in various roles as we try to please others and ourselves. This is part of seeking to fulfil our need for identity. The identities change in seasons of life – child, student, parent, employee, lover, retired, bereaved.

There is no need for pretence in the silver years – as the masks come off and we face ourselves, our questions, our own Pandora's Box. Often there



is confusion of identity, little sense of value and uncertainty about the purpose of life lived. Are the silver years really all about diminishing loss that fades to nothing?



Yes it's true, God wants to be connected with you despite the masks and the blockages. His Son Jesus Christ, came to connect you to God – this is the whole purpose of Christmas and Easter. The heart of the Christian message is God's heart for you.



HOW TO CONNECT

Life is as fragile as a silver thread, but God wants you to receive new life in Christ.

Take this moment to hand over your life to him and make the connection – he promises to make all things new. Think about this well-known Bible verse:

“For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life” (John 3 v 16)

CONSIDER the diagram below if you want to be able to call God ‘Father’ and receive a new start as His child.



Transformation of your life is a prayer away – if you truly want this, you could use the following words as a prayer of connection:

“God, I’m reaching out to you. Come and take my disappointments, failures, painful memories and all the wrong things I’ve done. I am truly sorry for all I’ve done that has been selfish and hurtful to you and to others you brought into my life. I was supposed to love you and to love them, but instead I loved myself much more. You know all the ways I have missed the mark in terms of the best you wanted for me – forgive me, for your son Jesus’ sake. I don’t yet fully understand the cross but I do know that Jesus didn’t die for his sins, but that somehow it was for mine. I need your help more than words can say and I choose to trust you for each day of the journey that’s left until you bring me home to be with you. So Father, take this, my prayer of connection, as I hand over my life to you. I am your child (say your name)’ PS – I know you offer to be with me by your Holy Spirit, and I would like this too!

If you have said this prayer in your heart and truly meant it, you have found the need of your soul – your life now connected to God as the Father who loves you.

So, you are for ever:

- A child of God (your true and lasting identity, finally discovered through Christ)
- Loved by God (yes, your value is measured by the gift that God gave, the life of His Son for you)
- Enjoying God (He wants to see you enjoy this new life He's given you – a purpose that brings Him joy)


As I reflect back over my life I think the most satisfying thing has been about building relationships with people and with God.
